The "Another Play in Paradise" route in the "Dolomitenhütte" climbing garden has been awarded one of the five "Great Lines" by thousands of sports climbers throughout Tyrol.

Difficulty: VI-IX+ (several routes, which start from difficulty 6c)

Sealevel: 1.600 m

Orientation: S / W / N

Rock: Limestone

Sektoren/Routen: 6 / 116

Steepness: mostly vertical to slightly overhanging

Climbing: edges, good technique demandet, athletic

Belaying: well - bolts

Wall height: 10 – 60 m

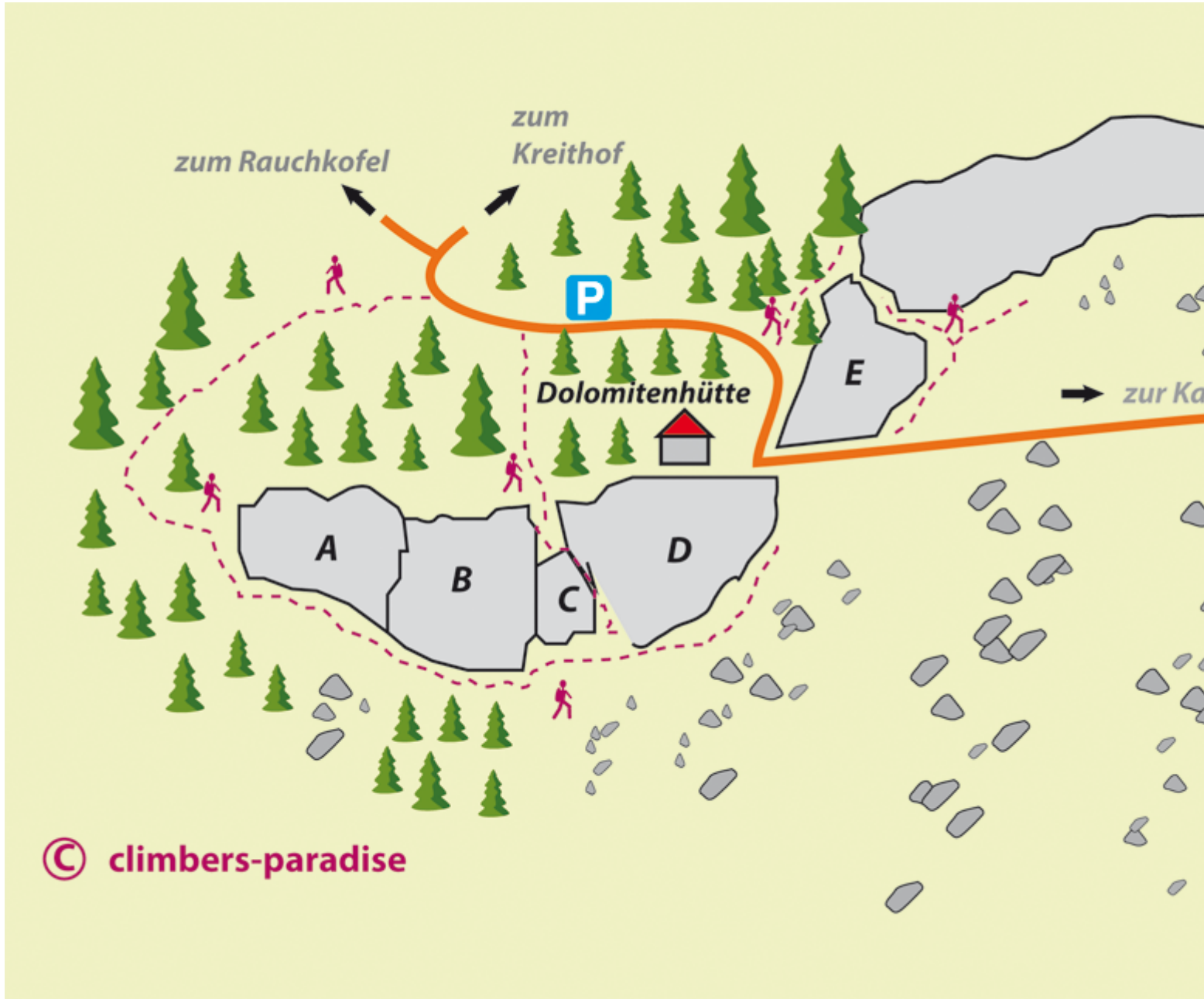
In case of rain is climbing in parts possible
